



- Cross border cooperation and public awareness in flood prevention











Different type of partners in FLAPP




- Most partners operate on regional level


- Leuven Belgium

- Towns where separated in 1945
- Cooperation intensified since the 1990ies
- Application for the European Capital of Culture in 2010






Nysa flooded in 1981 and 2002



Case study: Cross border risk map for Görlitz and Zgorzelec



Expected results



- Risk zone map and flood information map in 3 languages (German, Polish, English)
- Policy recommendation for mutual calamity management and spatial planning

Relation with EU initiative

- EU Action programme
- Preparation of flood directive
- Practical 'mirror' for policy makers:
 - test draft-directive via realistic cases
 - concrete implications for water managers
